





Buynow-pay later is the fastest-growing contributor to debt in the world's most

4. Plan for your future. This may include a mortgage, marriage, children, college tuition, and retirement.

To plan for your future, you must keep an eye on the intended goal, and it is not easy. Life comes with a multitude of challenges, and it is even harder without a plan. You will need to set aside funds for everything you desire including those unforeseen emergencies. There was a savings technique called the envelope method. Take some time to research the full plan when you have an opportunity.

robust economy, the United States.

2. Develop a budget and review it regularly to ensure there is no excess and if there is, redirect those funds into areas to reduce debt.

Instant gratification is what drives buy now pay later behavior. If you have avoided the buy now pay later temptation, Congratulations! After saving one-tenth of all your earnings, you will have a full year's salary saved after 10 years.

3. Seek alternative vehicles to invest your savings in to increase your profits.

An uninformed person will allow money to idly sit in a checking or savings account not working for them when the bank is offering high-interest CDs or high-yield saving accounts. Each person thinks that their money is inconsequential; nothing could be further from the truth. Collectively, we are a significant force in this economy, but we must stop seeing ourselves as individuals.

a month and purchased a \$500,000 policy. 15 years later his policy has a cash value of \$150,000 to supplement his retirement income and a death benefit of \$650,000. This created a win-win for him and his family.

Term insurance example: Male 35 and his wife 30 with two kids and planning to have more. I recommend a 30-year Term policy with "buy term and invest the difference in mind". This concept allows younger individuals a low barrier of entry to afford the product, with the cost of insurance running about \$30-\$40 a month. On the investment side, this couple will each have at least \$100 to put away from the savings between buying term insurance versus a whole life policy.

But so many investors are still talking about "I remember when you could get 14% on Certificates of Deposit". Your true desires are just that, desires. It is great if you have someone to share your dreams with, but most people tend to go it alone. I have become an accountability partner for thousands of clients with many successes and unfortunately some fail-

The August 10th episode of the popular Tamron Hall Show literally got off to a fiery start. As audience members were lin-





Military Ceremony Honoring Five of the Nation's First WWII Black U.S. Marines with the Congressional Gold Medal on June 23rd

early 20,000 African-Americans served in the Montford Point Marine units during World War II. Of these, 12,738 were deployed overseas in defense battalions or combat support companies or as stewards in the Messman Branch.

It has been twelve (12) years since the nation's relatively obscure first WWII Black Marines were initially awarded the Congressional Gold Medal by President Barack Obama and the 112th U.S. Congress. These WWII Marines became national heroes and their story was blasted across every major TV network in America.

However, many of the original 20,000 black Marines that trained at the segregated facility at Camp Montford Point, Camp Lejeune, NC, never received their honors

because many had deceased, while others were in nursing homes, or hospice, and may have been otherwise disabled. Since that

time, President/National Commandant Robert B. Middleton of the Montford Point Marines of America, has been on a nationwide mission to locate other WWII Black Marines who may still be alive, or their immediate families to make the Congressional Gold Medal Award posthumously.

As a result of these efforts, five (5) Congressional Gold Medals will be presented to the families of these heroic U.S. Marines at the 14th Annual National Her-

itage Military Banquet & Awards Ceremony, hosted by the Montford Point Marines of America on Sunday, June 23, 2024, at Burton Manor in Livonia, MI. Retired Marine Corps MajGen. Cornell Wilson will be the guest speaker and participate in officiating the presentation of awards along with other military dignitaries.

Today, it is believed that there are fewer than 300 original WWII Montford Point Marines remaining of the approximately 20,000 that trained at the segregated Camp Montford Point (MCB) New River, Camp Lejeune, between 1942-1949. President Middleton says he is delighted to celebrate two (2) of WWII Black Marine centenarians residing in Detroit; Lee Newby (recently deceased) and Butler Martin (cur-

rently 101 years old). Both of these Marines were interviewed by CNN and WDIV TV Channel 4.

Finally, during the awards segment of the program, the President of Hidden Pioneers, Inc, Bill Montgomery, will be flying to Detroit from Corona, CA, to present the Lifetime Achievement Award to a young lady named Emeline King, the first female African-America, Transportation Designer at the Ford Motor Company who designed the Mustang and the Thunderbird. Her energy and infectious personality will certainly inspire the audience, Middleton says. We encourage the public to attend this fascinating and momentous event. Michigan's State Trade Expansion Program (MISTEP)

Program description: MI-STEP is a grant reimbursement program that can help you export your goods and services from the Wolverine State to foreign markets. Incentive: Receive up to \$15K in reimbursements for eligible business expenses, including international marketing and trade show participation costs.

General requirements:

- Be a Michigan-based small business
- Be able to provide a Michigan Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) annual report or business structure filings from a county registrar's office
- Understand how exporting works and the cost of doing business with foreign buyers
- Provide an employer identification number (EIN) linked to a Michigan address

- Be in good standing with the Michigan Department of Treasury and other regulatory agencies
- Be an export-ready U.S. company
- Have a product or service consisting of at least 51% U.S. content
- Minimum gross annual revenue of \$100K
- Wholesale distributors of imported products are not eligible for MI-STEP grants

How to apply: Access and submit a completed MI-STEP grant application through the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) Project Portal.

Match on Main Grant Program Description:

Match on Main is a reimbursement grant program for eligible small businesses operating in a Michigan business district. Incentive: Be reimbursed up to \$25K for eligible expenses on project activities, such as the cost of making interior building renovations to a permanent commercial space.

General requirements:

- Have a local government, downtown development authority, Michigan Main Street program, or other eligible organization apply on your behalf.
- Be headquartered in Michigan
- Be located within a traditional downtown, historic, or mixeduse location zoned for concentrated commercial development in Michigan
- Sell products or services face to face as an eligible business

• Have a proposed project that incurs eligible expenses, such as costs for interior building renovations or electrical improvements

Michigan Workplace Improvement to Safety and Health (MIWISH)

Grant Program Description:



Property tax payment plans are available now!

Interest Reduction Stipulated Payment Agreement (IRSPA)

This payment plan reduces the interest rate from 18% to 6% for eligible taxpayers. To sign up, you must own and live in your home, and have a Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) and ID that proves residency.

Stipulated Payment Agreement (SPA)

Available to everybody, this plan allows a taxpayer to pay taxes pursuant to a payment schedule. The plan will avoid foreclosure provided that payments are submitted per the agreed upon schedule.

Distressed Owner Occupant Extension (DOOE)

This program is not available to everyone. If you own and live in the property, and are suffering financial hardship you may qualify for this program. Proof of ownership, occupancy, and hardship are required.

Pay As You Stay Payment Agreement (PAYSPA)

Only for those who have first applied for their local municipality's Poverty Tax Exemption (PTE) and received an approval. Once notified by your local Assessor's office and deemed eligible, our office will mail you a notification letter with your Reduced Amount Due. You will have the option of paying a lump sum (additional 10% off) or enrolling into a PAYSPA.
